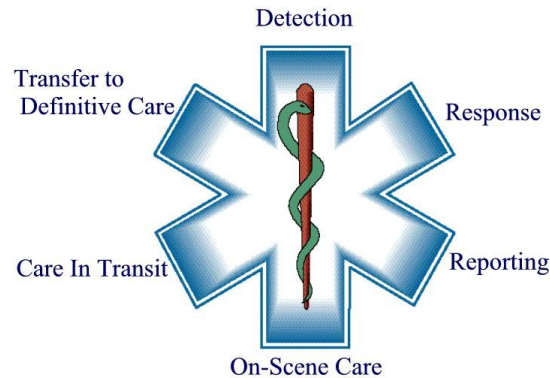
## Other EMS Training Services Available
